INFORMATION: USA FENCING MEMBERSHIP/INSURANCE

Zeta Fencing is a member club of USA Fencing, the official governing body for all fencers in the United States. USA Fencing provides Liability Insurance for member clubs, as well as Secondary Medical/Accident Insurance for its fencers. In order to be covered under the insurance policy, all individuals participating in any fencing activities at the club must be individual members of US Fencing.

Every fencer has to sign up as a member or renew his/her membership with USA Fencing before fencing for the first time in a season. For beginners, a non-competitive, annual membership is \$10.

We cannot accept applications for USA Fencing memberships at the club. Here is how to sign up online:

- 1) Go to <https://member.usafencing.org/>
- 2) Click "REGISTER".
- 3) Create an account and fill in your fencer's information. Please use the student's name, not your own (unless you are the fencer)!
- 4) Follow the sign-up process. Sign up for *New England Division*, competing for *Zeta Fencing*.
- 5) Choose the Membership Level:
 - For Beginner, Intermediate, Cadet, and Adult classes, choose USA Fencing—Non-Competitive (\$10.00).
 - All competing fencers need to have a competitive membership of USA Fencing (\$85.00).
- 6) Pay and finish the registration.
- 7) Print out the page that confirms the new membership and bring/send it to the club. You can also email a screenshot or forward the confirmation email (USA Fencing Membership Transaction Receipt) from USA Fencing.

WE NEED PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP FROM ALL FENCERS BEFORE PROGRAMS START TO COMPLY WITH OUR INSURANCE POLICY. WE CANNOT LET ANYBODY FENCE WHO IS NOT SIGNED UP WITH USA FENCING.
